Navigating Covid Cases

Thank you so much for the continued support from parents, staff and governors over the past weeks in dealing with the positive cases in the community. Please remember that children with any of the following symptoms must not attend school and seek a PCR test: a new, continuous cough; high temperature (above 37.8'); or loss/change in sense of taste and/or smell.

Some of our families have experienced symptoms different to those listed officially. Please do remain vigilant and seek a PCR test if in any doubt. We are also happy to work with and support families that have a confirmed case if they choose to isolate all members of the household.

Year 2 - Great Fire of London

Year 2 enjoyed a very exciting end to their topic with a visit from the fire service and the annual recreation of the Great Fire of London. Children have been exploring the reason that the fire was so devastating and why it spread so quickly. This has led into many areas of the curriculum, including art, DT, PE and English.
