Half-termly update from the Governing Board

As you may be aware, last Thursday was a very busy day for the school as we welcomed an inspector to undertake our Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS).

A SIAMS inspection focuses on the school's Christian vision, the provision the school makes because of this vision and how effective this provision is in enabling all pupils to flourish.

As Governors we met with the inspector ourselves but were **hugely** proud of the pupils and staff as they showed the school off to its very best and articulated in words and actions how 'We live and work in harmony with love for one another so we can achieve our potential in a community of lifelong learners'. Thank you to the parents who gave time to speak with the inspector too. The writing-up and critical reading of the inspection report takes a few weeks, but we will share that with you as soon as possible.

As if that wasn't enough to fit into a day, Thursday was also the date of the second Full Board meeting this term. Alongside the regular business of the meeting it was great to see the freshly decorated Year 5 classroom. Our thanks to the team of volunteers who have transformed that space for the benefit of the pupils' learning and well-being.

Governors are often in and around school informally but as part of our work we make regular, more formal visits to monitor the impact of the strategic decisions the Board takes and learn about how the curriculum is implemented. At Thursday's meeting we shared reports of visits relating to RE, Science, Literacy, French, SEND and are looking forward to scheduling some times to join Collective Worship in the new term.
