Our new curriculum thread for this half term is: **Community: Empathy**. On Monday, I was delighted to be able to pop into Year 4 and share some of their class text – The Boy at the Back of the Class. This text explores the journey of a Syrian refugee in a UK primary school.

Meanwhile, Year 2 have been exploring Fairtrade and understanding the different profits received by the groups of workers involved in the production of chocolate.

Year 3,5 and 6 have been exploring different communities and how they operated through history in their history-led topics:

- Y3 Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages;
- Y5 Egyptology;
- Y6 The Vikings fearsome raiders or farmers and traders; are we fair to the Vikings?

Looking at other aspects of empathy, children in Reception are exploring their own preferences and the preferences of others through their 'Yuck or Yummy' topic. Year 1 are exploring applying empathy in thinking about what like was like in the time of their grandparents through comparing the toys they would have enjoyed.

### Lent Challenge

This week, we have continued with Bishop Stephen's Lent Challenge – 'live life to the full this lent'.

We explored the idea of what it means to be a shepherd – linking this to the analogy of the Lord being a shepherd and psalm 23.

Meanwhile, we continued to understand the role of a Bishop – as a shepherd for the diocese and were delighted to receive a gift from the diocese.

We unpacked a beautiful new trophy for celebrating courageous advocacy. Next week, School Council will be launching a new challenge to classes to explore those things that need to change in different aspects of our world. We will be encouraging children to stand up for what they know is right and make a difference – through applying courageous advocacy.


# Prayer Meeting - Thursday 2nd March
