I am writing to congratulate you on your school's outstanding achievement in the 2023 Phonics Screening Check.

We want to ensure every child develops a firm grasp of phonics as the basis on which to improve standards of reading. As such I was delighted to see your results.

With 100 per cent of pupils in Year 1 at Great and Little Shelford CofE (Aided) Primary School meeting the expected standard in the check, your school is in the top 1 per cent of all primary schools in the country.

The latest figures show that 83 per cent of pupils who met the expected standard in the check went on to achieve at least the expected standard in reading at key stage 2 in 2023, which underlines the importance of developing the ability to decode words effectively at an early age.

Your particular success in teaching phonics and early reading so effectively means your pupils are developing a firm foundation, from which they can become increasingly fluent and develop a lifelong love of reading.

I would like to thank you for your commitment and success in this vital area of a child's early education and congratulate you, your staff and pupils again on all you have achieved.

#### **Balancing and Scheduling in Quality Time**

Finding those moments to spend what's often called 'quality time' can be difficult amongst busy family lives. However, the impact of just 10–15 minutes a day can make a huge difference.

As children grow, their relationships with us as parents shift slightly. At the core, is the trusting, loving, caregiving core on which the parent-child relationship is founded. However, despite this changing and evolving relationship, spending time together always remains important. It just may be how that time is spent that changes.

An interesting school of thought is to 'be exceptional' for 10 minutes a day. Some people live by a premise that they focus on being an exceptional version of whatever they aim to be at that moment. For example, an exceptional parent returning from work. Of course, it isn't about giving a child what they want in that instance – it is about giving them what they need... time together, actively listening to them and sharing positive experiences. Each family finds its own way to spend what they believe is quality time. But it's really about those shared lived experiences together. That sense of connection is crucial in building a healthy parent-child relationship. **You can read a helpful research summary here**.
