Yesterday afternoon, all staff met to review the current procedures in-place. We are also pleased to have had a sample of parent feedback from one of the classes. Based on this and our staff

general review, please see how we will go forward with home learning:				
Theme	Current Set-up	Response to Feedback		
Frequency of work being released. Some parents prefer daily release, some would prefer a weekly release.	Materials are released each day for the current / following day.	The materials will be available the day before. Teachers will provide a brief weekly summary of themes. E.g. Spelling – -tion, -sion, -cian suffixes Maths – multiplication methods English – poetic features We would not release a whole week in advance because we use pupils' responses to adapt and plan our learning and teaching activities. (This is known as Assessment for Learning).		
Amount of work Much positive feedback. Some themes of a difficulty in managing siblings' various learning activities.	 Pupils have: 1 English activity; 1 Maths activity; 1 other activity; 3 pelling; Reading. There is a family learning menu to support families with more than one child, which staff may signpost in the 'other subject'. 	 W/c 30/3 – all staff will ask pupils to select from the 'Family Learning Menu' for their 'other subject' to ensure families can coordinate timetables. Staff will look into balancing the larger English and Maths activities on each day. For example if a larger English piece is required, the maths activity will be shorter and vice-versa. For families finding it difficult to complete all learning activities, please prioritise the submitted task. 		
Submission Generally positive feedback about this – once per day is ideal / keeps pupils motivated. Some think less-often is possible.	Pupils submit one piece per day to their class email address by 3:00pm. Feedback from staff is sent by the end of the next working day.	Continue with one per day. Staff are responsible for tracking and monitoring the pupils' progress and attainment, even during home learning. Please note – submission after 3:00pm may result in later feedback.		
Vlog Some parents have asked if it is possible for staff to take part in this or other video elements.	Currently, this is an additional element of what the school is offering to aim to keep the wider elements of school life alive.	After Easter, teachers to consider and choose if they would like to include video or audio elements.		





Here is a very brief summary of the tweaks:

- Materials will be available the day before;
- w/c 30/3 all 'other' activities for the whole school will be for families to choose from the <u>'Family Learning Menu'</u>;
- Staff will aim to balance the English and maths activities;
- Please prioritise the submitted task;
- Late submission may lead to late feedback;
- Teachers will consider optional video / audio elements.

We hope that these small amendments will help to continue to improve our home learning offer. As you will see from this review and all of the materials on offer on our <u>class pages</u> and <u>home</u> <u>learning section</u>, we are endeavouring to make it work for our 209 pupils! Thank you for your continued support and your dedication to your children's learning.
