This week in school, governors have been working together to further develop the school's vision, based on the work that has taken place with staff and pupils. Tonight sees the turn of our older pianists and other instrumentalists leading a concert! We are very much looking forward to listening to their performances. We look forward to welcoming many of you, our instrumental teachers and Mrs. Barlow to the concert.

It is hard to believe that we are almost two thirds of the way through the current academic year. I am not sure where the time has gone! It is always beneficial to take a moment to pause and reflect on all of the work that has taken place since September by all members of the school community. Thank you for your continued support.
