

Mike Paduano - Obituary by Gillian Paduano

Mike was born in Stockport and grew up in Disley with his brother. His parents met during the war at Copt Hall in Surrey where his father was sent as an Italian prisoner of war and his mother worked for the Land Army. They were reunited in 1950.

His father was an engineering draughtsman, and his mother ran the village shop. Mike attended Marple Hall Grammar School and spent a happy childhood learning practical skills, observing wildlife, and nurturing an interest in cooking in Italy. He took a degree in Geography, Economics and Archaeology at Leicester University after an enforced gap year following a gas accident.



Mike bought his first motorcycle aged sixteen for practical reasons and became hooked – his interest in cars and motorcycles never diminishing. During his twenties he worked variously for Swizzels Matlow, Motorist Discount Centres and on an Israeli farm near the Dead Sea, as well as a spell as a Territorial Army volunteer.

In 1987 he trained as a Teacher in English as a Foreign Language and worked in Tortosa (where he met Gillian) and San Sebastian in Spain before returning to take a Post Graduate Certificate in Education at Oxford Brookes.

His first school was Hadleigh County Junior School near Telford before he moved to Stalybridge and taught at several schools in Greater Manchester. After marrying Gillian in 1993 they relocated to Cambridgeshire, and he joined Great and Little Shelford Primary School in 1995.

As a teacher Mike took his enthusiasm for life, food and practical skills into the classroom and it was infectious. At Shelford Mike became the established Year 6 teacher and a member of the Senior Leadership Team with official responsibilities for residential trips, maypole dancing, SATS, cycling proficiency, the leavers' service, and student teacher training in liaison with Homerton College. His remit however extended beyond this; swimming pool, PTA bike sale, maths challenge and mulled wine at the Christmas Fair were just some of his regular callings, as was his role of school handyman and mechanic – where a simple lunchtime oil check could become an extra curricula activity.

After retirement in 2018 he briefly achieved his perfect work/life balance – teaching part time, helping with scouts, and rebuilding a classic motorcycle – but it was cut short by his cancer. He was immensely proud of his children and leaves Gillian, son, Wilf and daughter, Beatrice.
