## How the PE and sport premium should be spent:

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport we offer.

This means that we should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- build **capacity and capability** within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- 1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school;
- 2. the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement;
- 3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport;
- 4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils;
- 5. increased participation in competitive sport.
