

School assemblies have continued to teach and build on our understanding of our ethos and values over the last two days. In yesterday's assembly, under the umbrella of our "**Be Safe**" Star Value, issues of personal safety (the NSPCC PANTS strategy) and online safety (the ACE curriculum), were discussed.
