Dear Parents and Carers,

As we are progressing through Lent, we have been exploring different ways with the pupils that they can remember Jesus' time in the dessert through living more simply. In addition to this, Bishop Stephen's Lent Challenge has been set to ensure we are all interacting with members from different generations, showing love to one another.

One way in which this has commenced has been Year 6s visit to Great Shelford Free Church to lead collective worship for the local community: this centred on the Lord's Prayer. As you will know, the school's interaction within the community and the community's interaction within the school have been long established.

Another way in which the school has been supported by the local community is through a legacy left at and enhanced by the Wellcome Trust. Mrs. Clarke and I attended the Genome Campus this week to embark on the steps to achieve the school's Primary Science Quality Mark. Our main aims through this are to raise the profile of science within the school, using inquiry skills to support their learning. In addition to this, we would like our pupils to have a strong awareness of the science-based careers that could be open to them in the future. After all, 65% of primary pupils will go on to a job that doesn't yet exist!

Yesterday, we have been very fortunate to welcome GenR8 into school to share very important messages linked to the Easter story with us in our collective worship. Pupils were particularly wowed by the way in which the GenR8 representatives retold the events of Good Friday with one single piece of A3 paper, some accurate folding and careful tearing! From the Chair of Governors

The current terms of office of our two parent governors conclude at the end of this school year, so elections will be held during the summer term to fill these positions for the period 2019-2023. Both Sarah Bullock and James Doubleday have given great service to the school since 2015, but each has decided not to seek a further term, so we are definitely looking for newcomers.

I would also like to update you on the subject of academization. Some time ago I informed parents that governors had decided to pursue membership of the Diocese of Ely Multi Academy Trust (DEMAT), but as we have undertaken further investigation and review, both of DEMAT and our future prospects under the Local Authority (LA), we have decided against joining DEMAT at this stage. We believe that under its new leadership the LA provides the best option for the future of the school and the education of the children which is of course our paramount concern. However, we will be undertaking an annual review of this important subject so that we would be ready to take the academy route if that should become the best option for the school in the future.

Finally, I would like to share some unexpected but very good news that I received recently. Two parents whose connection with the school through their children ends this year have made a generous donation to the school, recognising the way that their children have thrived here and wanting to help the school to develop further. This donation will be used to support music

opportunities for children over the coming years, and I am sure that will involve activities within the wider community as well as in school. The donors wish to remain anonymous, but I would like to take this opportunity to thank them on behalf of the whole school community. It is gratifying to see people who are willing to support the school beyond the time of their direct connection, whether financially or in other ways, and to help the school to develop its position in the community.
