


As you will remember, Science has been a key focus for us since last summer as we continue our journey towards the Primary Science Quality Mark. As part of this, we have been very fortunate to have the support of so many STEM Ambassadors, including many parents! This week, we welcomed Susanna and Maria from the Wellcome Trust to lead some exciting sessions with pupils that were (literally) hands-on! Children in Y3 and Y4 explored how to wash their hands correctly, revealing what they missed with an ultra-violet light! In addition, we also welcomed Dr. Whitworth, who gave her STEM talk around her work – thank you! Pupils across the school were fascinated to learn about how zebrafish could be used to investigate how tuberculosis could be most effectively treated with different antibiotics. On the left, you can see some of our Y6 pupils, who stayed afterwards. They learnt a little more about the protective equipment used, including the green lab coats worn when working with more hazardous experiments

This week, we have also been very pleased to welcome M. Cedric Gance - Headteacher of a school in Creil, France - to Shelford. This is his third visit to the school. We have been sharing practice, along with comparing and contrasting the British and French education systems. M. Gance has also been warmly welcomed by pupils into each class over the week.
