European Day of Languages

On Monday 26th September, the whole school enjoyed celebrating the wealth of languages spoken across the school ... extending beyond European languages! Pupils thought about the power of learning foreign languages and being able to access other cultures:

'You can make new friends and order food!'

'You can read books from other countries.'

'You can talk to people without using a dictionary to translate.'

Some highlights from each class are featured below: Reception Class enjoyed a fun afternoon with Madame Kennedy, which included singing songs, naming some animals and counting 1-10 in French!

Year 1 - Madame Kennedy also worked with Year 1. Some children counted to 10 in different languages. After that they worked on their French speaking skills, including sing 'Une souris verte' and learning the names of animals.

Year 2 created a tally of the languages spoken in the class and transferred onto a bar chart followed by a team quiz on languages and use iPads to create fact files about a chosen country.

Year 3 enjoyed several challenges including matching flags to countries and listening to 'Hello' spoken in a variety of languages they had to identify. They discovered fascinating facts such as Europe has over 200 different languages!
Year 6 took the opportunity to open letters from our partner school in Morocco. The children here learn French as a second language so wrote to us in French which presented a challenging but enjoyable translation task!

Finally, for any enthusiastic linguist, don't forget that we hold a French Club after school on Tues/Weds. Please enquire with the office to express your interest
