Our curriculum thread this half term, our curriculum thread is:



This thread links each class' topic and some specific events.

At the moment, our Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children are preparing to retell a very special story through their Nativity performance. This underpins their key learning in RE and links to their topics:

Reception – Tell us a Story – What makes a story? *Telling and* exploring a range of stories.

Year 1 - Shelford Stars - What are our stories so far? What are the recent changes in history? Stories of how things have changed recently.

Year 2 – **Heroes and Heroines** – Which heroes and heroines led a significant sorry? *The stories of inspirational figures*.

Year 3 – **Inverness** – How does Cambridge Compare? The story of a contrasting location and the Loch Ness Monster.

Year 4 - The Romans - Who were they and how did they change Britain? The story of how our country changed in history.

Year 5 – **Space - Star Gazers** – what is the significance and story of human exploration in the "Space Race"? *The story of the space race.*

Year 6 - Maya Civilisation - What is the significance of their legacies? The story of one civilisation and their legacies.

Activity Idea

Here is a brilliant idea for a Christmas decoration that would look great on any Christmas tree!



Equipment needed –

- A pack of assorted stripy/coloured straws
- DecorationsGlue
- 1 Using scissors, cut a length of straw to create the bottom layer of the tree.

2 - Choose another colour and cut different lengths going up the tree, shortening them each time. 3 Use 2 straws to create the trunk or a lolly stick. Stick the different lengths of straws onto the trunk using glue starting from the bottom.

4 -At the top, stick a star to finish the effect!

5 -Use some string to create a loop to hang on the tree.
