Pupils later wrote letters to their penpals at the school. In the afternoon, pupils enjoyed creating lavender bags, before sampling a selection of French gourmet treats at their pique-nique!

Finally, to round off the day, parents were invited to hear three French songs that the class had learnt (all within Covid restrictions)!



As part of our global learning, we will be working on an exciting project with our partner school in Morocco (SS/Annour) and two other schools with whom we have formed a cluster (these are secondary schools; one UK based, and the other is also in Morocco). The project is called 'A Window into Wellbeing' and will take into account four areas: diet, exercise, art and music, and their impact on how we feel, especially in relation to our lockdown experiences, mental health awareness and wellbeing.

Relationships and Sex Education
