Governors' Note

Governors recently met for the second Full Board meeting of the year. We discussed how valuable it was to welcome parents, staff and governors to our School Development Plan meeting in the summer term. School leaders and governors have taken time to consider the feedback and incorporate it into the planning for this year.

In particular, we noted how parents value effective communication between school and home. This was a specific focus for us in 2021 so it is appropriate for us to now monitor the effectiveness and implementation of the communications policy and processes as part of our work this year. We are also focussed on how we communicate our inclusive values and will be looking at how these values are shared with all members of our community.

Another theme that was raised was homework. Again, this is a topic that has been carefully considered by the Board in the past. We remain committed to our current evidence-based policy, which can be found on the school website, and are delighted that a strong reading culture is promoted through daily reading (and phonics) at home, along with a range of other resources that staff share through the year.

Parents and stakeholders also expressed the importance of sustainability and this is equally an area we are very keen to develop. The governors will be forming a working group to explore opportunities to build on the school's current teaching and learning on climate and sustainability, including forest school and eco council. We are looking ahead to planning for 2024/25 and looking at how the school can develop a climate action plan, in line with the <u>Department for Education's Sustainability and Climate Change Strategy</u>.

The final area noted from the feedback related to behaviour. Shelford School has operated a Therapeutic Behaviour Policy for many years now and as governors, we will be looking into the impact of this on a range of aspects of school life throughout the academic year.

Thank you again for engaging with the school's development plans last summer. We look forward to inviting you to do so again this coming year, especially as we near the end of our 3-year plan and look to shape a new one.
