Welcome to Summer term 2 – with our curriculum thread of **Curiosity**! children's topics are all linked to this thought-provoking theme! To kick off the half term, we've enjoyed Empathy Day – yesterday. This piques curiosity into the feelings and thoughts of others.

We all gathered in the hall for a worship session led by Mrs Alderson, who has been working with Empathy Lab (the organisation behind Empathy Day). All children created some empathy resolutions – after hearing from Jacqueline Wilson, Cressida Cowell and Chris Ridell as to what their empathy resolutions were. Children placed their resolution in words and illustrations on bunting and these will shortly be adorning the classrooms!

Everyone gathered again after their sessions to share the variety of activities. The day's sessions also included exploring empathy through a variety of texts.

### **Environment Day**

Today, children have enjoyed an Environment Day, with links to our Internstional Schools Award Status – on sustainability.

Mrs Bane has planned and led the day and this kicked off with a Collective Worship session together. Throughout the day, children have been enjoying workshops with a representative from Green up Your Act! A summary of the workshops from Green up found below:

One of the fist subjects pupils mention when it comes to environmental topics is the issue of litter. 62% of people in England drop litter, although only 28% will admit to it. Clearing up the streets and green spaces in England alone costs £1 billion a year. There are not just direct costs involved with the dropping of litter, the RSPCA receives around 7,000 calls a year regarding animals that have been injured by litter; this includes pets as well as wildlife.

Firstly, we explore the issues through an interactive presentation on the subject of litter in the UK and examining single use plastics and their alternatives. Each pupil will then be invited to decorate a cork fish with colourful recycled scales they have made to bring awareness to the problem of litter in our surroundings. This highlights how we can all play a part in supporting a beautiful and healthy natural environment. The fish create eye-catching artworks which can be taken home or displayed in school. The main aim of this workshops is to raise young people's awareness of the problem litter and the effect it has on our natural environment.


## Campout




