Last week, we shared a summary of the EYFS and KS1 curriculum since January. This week, I am pleased to share a few details about our KS2 classes' work.

Our Y3 pupils are fully-engrossed in their Mountains topic. They have written instructions into preparing for a mountain expedition. In addition, they have looked at Hokusai's work in art, inspiring their own mountain scenes.

Y4 have commenced their Europe topic and have enjoyed exploring the variety of maps of different European countries. On Monday,



I really enjoyed seeing them grapple with the challenge of completing a cut up Europe map as a team in silence! They used some great non-verbal communication and group work skills!

Meanwhile, Y5 have been polishing their 500 word stories for the BBC Competition. In addition to this, they have delved into Shakespeare's Macbeth!



A text-based theme has also led some learning in Y6. Pupils have been studying the text Wonder, which is centred on a disfigured child. They have explored this text through their English lessons, but also applied themes into their art work (left).

Science Spot STEM Talk – 4/2/2020 Pharmacologist

A pharmacologist studies medicines and how they work. I work in a team that is trying to come up with medicines to treat dementia. Dementia is an illness which mainly affects elderly people and makes them confused and lose their memory so that they are no longer able to look after themselves. I work with chemists who design and make molecules that we hope will one day be new medicines. We test the molecules in cells which we grow in our laboratory, which we can look at through a microscope. We also use special mice which lose their memory to see if they are less forgetful after being given one of our molecules.
